# HEMIPLEGIC HAND

Fred is conducting a project on the hemiplegic hand. The research is focusing on manual mobilization of the carpal bones additional to functional training in patients after stroke with loss of reach and grip function. Assumed is that it will have an additional value for the patients, since there is strong indication that muscle and joint contractures develop because of relative immobilization and disuse.

The project could be transferred to answer the question if a specific PNF approach with timing for emphasis will have an additional value. All the pre study on prevalence and incidence and also on clinical importance and valid and reliable measurements is already done.
